### Sports Premium Funding Report 2021-22 Academic Year

#### What is School Sport Funding?

The government is providing additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. It is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. From Sept 2019, funding is a £16000 lump sum with an additional £10.00 per child aged 5-11. As a school we were allocated £19,600 for the academic year 2021-2022 (Last year, we underspent our allocation by £16,016 due to Covid restrictions). Schools have flexibility on how they use the funding but it should be used to increase and improve physical education available to pupils. Development and training of staff to provide sustainable improvements is also a key focus.
