1. Create a map of Europe		
<div>Description</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none">Create a map of the UK - either as a poster or as a 3D model.Label your map to show any landmarks or counties that are significant to you and your family e.g. where members of your family live, places you or your family have visited, places linked to any hobbies or foods you enjoy.</div>	<div>Size guidance</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none">Your model or poster should be no bigger than A3 size.</div> <div>Quality guidance</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none">Your model/poster is carefully made - it is sturdy enough for other people to look at without getting damaged.Your map is clear and colourful. Places can be easily identified.The quality of your work is to your usual standard or better.You have paid attention to detail, making others want to look closely.Your labels are informative and interesting - they explain why each place is significant to you and your family.You are able to talk confidently about your map and the places chosen.</div>	
2. Create an information leaflet		
<div>Description</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none">Choose a country or city that has some importance to your family.Provide geographical information about the place you have chosen. Describe its climate, physical and human features, famous landmarks, what life is like there etc.Explain how the place you have chosen is significant to your family. How are you connected? What makes it special?</div>	<div>Size guidance</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none">A leaflet of no more than 2 sheets of A4 paper.</div> <div>Quality guidance</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none">Your leaflet is well-presented (by hand or on the computer).You have included the features of a leaflet: headings, subheading, facts, paragraphs and bullet points, photos/pictures.The quality of your writing (vocabulary, punctuation, sentence structure etc.) is to your usual standard or better.You have included images and colour to capture your audience.You have included information about the place itself and how it is connected to your family.You may wish to include quotes from members of your family so they can share their opinions too.</div>	
3. Create a Google Slides presentation about a place you have visited		
<div>Description</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none">Think of a place you have visited in Europe (including the UK).Create a Google Slides presentation to show what you did there. Include photographs if you are able.Ensure you provide geographical information too. Describe its climate, physical and human features, famous landmarks, what life is like there etc.Give your opinion. What did you like about the place you have chosen and why?</div>	<div>Size guidance</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none">A presentation of no more than 10 slides.</div> <div>Quality guidance</div> <div><ul style="list-style-type: none">You provide background information about the place. Where it is in Europe, its climate, famous landmarks etc.Your slides show what you did during your visit.You are able to talk about your visit and share your opinion confidently.The information you provide is informative and interesting.You present your slides clearly and creatively.The quality of your work is to your usual standard or better, including how your facts have been written.</div>
