PRACTICAL TASK

1) <u>Make a model</u> Make a model of something from the Viking era. (No shop-bought models, please) For example: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A Viking weapon. • A Viking longboat. • A Viking helmet. • A Viking raid on the British mainland. • A Viking god. Be creative! Use a range of materials if you want to. You could even use clay!	<u>Size guidance</u> Shoebox size.	<u>Quality guidance</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make your model bold and clear so it stands out. • Make sure that you're ready to explain the making process as well. • Try to use some materials that you would be throwing away - recycling helps the environment!
2) <u>Visit a place of interest</u> Enjoy finding out about an aspect of the Vikings by visiting a museum or place of interest. Be ready to present some interesting facts you've learned from your visit. You might like to present the facts in a creative way! Here are some suggestions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A written recount with pictures; • A comic strip. 	<u>Size guidance</u> Dependent on the presentation type! Make sure it can be transported to school and kept in the classroom easily (nothing too big!).	<u>Quality guidance</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Make it as exciting as possible and use your creativity to think of a good way to present it. • Make sure that the facts you choose are very engaging. • Make sure you're ready to answer questions about what you discovered!
3) <u>Research a theme</u> Choose a theme on the Vikings e.g. major rulers, medicines, weapons, boats, religion etc. Write down 5 questions that you do not already know the answer to and find the answers by researching. Present your findings beautifully in your own way. Here are some suggestions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Google Slides presentation; • A poster; • A painting with information labels. 	<u>Size guidance</u> A3 max. paper size.	<u>Quality guidance</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In your own words, rather than copying and pasting from websites. • Pictures to help us understand! Hand-drawn or printed. • Make it as exciting as possible and use your creativity to think of a good way to present it. • The quality of your work is to your usual standard or better
