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1. RESEARCH TASK AND POSTER

<p><u>Description:</u> Choose a country from around the world. Research the foods that they grow and produce. Are these foods traded with other countries? Design a poster to share your information. You could also include extra relevant facts e.g. popular meals, eating traditions, food history.</p>	<p><u>Size guidance</u> Between A4 and A2.</p> <p><u>Quality guidance</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Excellent and creative presentation. • Accurate and relevant information is included. • Facts are written clearly. • Your work is organised using heading and subheadings. • Visual elements are included e.g. photos, diagrams, maps, drawings. • Sentences are written using your own words. • You show a Sense of Pride. • You can share your work confidently with others.
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2. PRACTICAL COOKING TASK (parental support required)

<p>Choose a recipe from another country and learn how to cook it. Present the recipe using your own words and pictures. Provide photos to show you have made the dish (ideally photos of you at different stages of the cooking process). Discuss what you made with members of your class or year group. Describe your personal experiences - Did you enjoy making the dish? What did you find tricky? Did the whole family try it? Did everyone like it? Would you make any changes if you were to make it again?</p>	<p><u>Quality Guidance</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A clear and well-presented recipe. • Images and photos show how you made the dish. • You include a picture of the final dish. • You are able to talk confidently about your experiences when you made the dish.
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3. FOOD-INSPIRED STORY

<p>Many stories are inspired by foods - James and the Giant Peach, Supertato, The Magic Porridge Pot, Handa's Surprise, Alice in Wonderland. Write your own short story inspired by food. Your ingredient could be the main character, the setting, allow your character to go on an adventure or help to solve their problems.</p>	<p><u>Size guidance</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • No more than 3 sides of writing (A4). <p><u>Quality guidance</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Your story is well presented (by hand or on the computer) • You have followed the story mountain format: Introduction, build up, problem, resolution and ending. • The quality of your writing (vocabulary, punctuation, sentence structure etc.) is to your usual standard or better. • You have included pictures to enhance the story.
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Method of sharing/celebrating/displaying projects

The children will show and discuss their projects with other children in their class/year group. Final pieces will contribute towards a year group display.
