# **BLACK HISTORY MONTH**

Today the children had an assembly on Black History Month where they talked about diversity and discussed this year's theme of 'Saluting our Sisters'. This year's theme highlights the achievements and contributions of black women throughout history. It shines a light on the women who have courageously battled oppression and advocated for change but have regularly had their work ignored or forgotten. Black History Month will hope to inspire the children to pursue their dreams. There's also a focus on themes like resilience, determination, self-care, and well-being.

Throughout the month, as shared in the year group weekly curriculum headlines, children will learn about different aspects of Black History. This month's focus is in addition to the diverse curriculum that is taught throughout the year.

### NATIONAL BLACK HISTORY MONTH POETRY COMPETITION

Linked with National Poetry Day earlier this week, we are encouraging children to take part in a National Black History Month Poetry Competition. Pupils can submit a poem about a pioneering black woman who has made an impact in their chosen field – whether famous or not. The deadline is 15th November 2023. We want children to learn about and celebrate black women who have made significant contributions in various fields. They can submit a poem about a pioneering black woman who has made an impact in their chosen field, explaining why they are an inspiration to you. The poems don't have to be about famous people; they can be about members of your family, women who have inspired you in your community, or even about you and your experiences as a woman or young person. We want children to get creative and have fun with it!

We would also like the children to copy their poem into Google Classroom Assignment so that we can share some of them in school (children will be able to do this from Monday). Alternatively, children could hand their handwritten poem into the box on the kidney shaped table in school so that we can all read them.
