Dear Parents/Carers of Children in Year 6,

The end of term is fast approaching and we thought some reminders would be helpful to you, as well as some information regarding the special activities planned for your child's final week of Primary School.

- **Carrier Bags** - The children need to bring a few carrier bags with them next week so that they can carry things from school if needed. These can be stored in their school bag very easily.
- **Books** - Most of the children (using their carrier bags) will be bringing their exercise books and work home. However, some children's books will need to remain in school until next year for moderation purposes. They can be collected in January 2023 from the school office.

Tuesday 19th and Wednesday 20th July- Production

As you are aware, our production should be taking place on Tuesday and Wednesday evening in front of live audiences. Please ensure all children have their costume in school on **Monday 18th July** for our dress rehearsal.

The children will be leaving their costumes at school, so please ensure that they arrive by **6.30 pm** on **for the evening performances** to give them sufficient time to get ready. The performances should finish at approximately **8.15 pm**. After the performances, there will be an opportunity for families to have a get-together over refreshments in the playground.

Tuesday 19th July- Water Fun

For the last part of the afternoon, the children will be able to take part in some water-based fun! If your child has a super soaker/water pistol (the bigger, the better) or even an empty squeeze bottle, then it would be great if they could bring this to join in with the fun.

The children may have the opportunity to have a go at sliding along a 'water-'slide' during which they will get very wet. Therefore, the children may wish to wear their PE kit on this day. If children would like to put on swimwear under their PE kit, they may do so.

Friday 22nd July- Last Day

On Friday, as is tradition, the children will be allowed to sign each other's t-shirts as a memento for their time here at SPJS. To make this process easier, we ask **parents/carers to send their children wearing their normal school uniform and bring with them an additional shirt / polo shirt that can be signed**. This way, the children can wear their normal shirt whilst collecting signatures on their extra shirt. If your child doesn't want to have a signed shirt they could bring in something else appropriate to be signed, like a notepad or a message book. Your child should also **bring in a pen that will write easily onto shirts**, like a biro or *Sharpie*. Fountain pens are not very good for signing shirts.

To commemorate their time here at SPJS, the children will receive a year book- thanks to the PTA for funding this and to Mrs Duggan, who has spent a lot of time putting it together.

It should be a very enjoyable week and one that the children will treasure.
