#### WATER SAFETY WORKSHOPS

On Friday 12th January, we had a special assembly and workshops about water safety and how to keep yourself and others safe when in and around water.

Children devised a list of different bodies of water, learnt the meanings of the different beach flags and spotted the dangers in several water-based scenarios.



Children were taught the following water safety codes:

- 1. STOP & THINK
- 2. STAY TOGETHER
- 3. CALL 999
- 4. FLOAT

We also learnt the acronym 'SAFE' which stands for:

- 1. S STAY
- 2. A AWAY
- 3. F FROM
- **4**. **E EDGE**

We hope that these sessions have helped the children to feel more confident in and around water and has reinforced the importance of keeping themselves safe whilst around water.


