#### RECYCLING WEEK

## TRIP TO BEDDINGTON ENERGY RECOVERY CENTRE



On Tuesday 17th October the eco reps went on a trip to Beddington Energy Recovery Centre where they listened to a talk about the importance of recycling and how waste that cannot be recycled is dealt with. They also learnt about how the plant powered electricity. During this trip, the children had an opportunity to see examples of how materials can be reused, for example, using an old pair of socks to make a cuddly toy. As a final task, the children had to look at some everyday items from a room in a house, and then sort them into the correct box for recycling.



They took what they learnt from the trip and shared their knowledge with the rest of the school in their assembly for recycling week.

#### LITTER PICKING ESCAPADES

On Wednesday 18th October, the eco reps from the Juniors merged with the eco reps from the Infants' to take part in a litter picking event. We went along Glebe path and found lots of hidden wrappers and papers hidden in the leaves on the sides of the path. The children worked in groups of 5 and it was a good experience for the older children to help the younger children. Taking part in this event made us realise that although from a distance the path looked clear, there was still a lot of litter that was found. Therefore litter picking is beneficial to keeping our area tidy and more environmentally friendly. Why not give it a go with your family?



In addition to raising awareness for recycling week, the children have optional tasks to complete including:

- entering a poster competition entries must be in by Friday 24th November.
- completing a photo challenge.
- making a poppy out of recyclable items.

#### **OUTDOOR LEARNING NEWS**

We are very pleased to share that children have spotted baby newts, newt tadpoles in the pond! Also we have found a small adult while minibeast hunting. The baby pigeon that was nesting in the tree in the Green Zone has fledged!





In Year 3 we planted our own radishes, pumpkin, peas and marigold for the allotment at the start of the year. We have been learnt about the different ways we can grow a plant (seed, bulb, tuber, runners and cuttings). We were able to show Year 3 the progress of the honeysuckle cuttings that Year 5 took. They have grown roots and are ready for planting.





In **Year 4** we have learnt about the different types of animals and had hands on play with how we digest food.



In **Year 6** we made a living tree out of different objects and our own space fungus to celebrate Space Week 4-10 October and UK Fungus Day on the 7th October.
