WOW BASKETBALL DAY



On Monday 18th September, SPJS were visited by the world's tallest basketball player, Paul Sturgess. Reaching a height of 7ft 7.26 (the children learnt that the .26 was a crucial part of being a world record holder!) Paul captivated us all with stories of his time professionally playing basketball for the Harlem Globetrotters, details about starring in several films and TV series and answering the very popular question: what is life like when you're the world's tallest basketball player?

In the morning, Paul shared that the Harlem Globetrotters start every game

with a 'magic circle', where all players form a circle and take it in turns to showcase

their best basketball tricks. He called upon Noah, Rahul, Saoirse and Henry to help him demonstrate what this looks like and taught them how to pass and control the ball using different parts of their bodies.

Throughout the day, each class had a basketball workshop with Paul that involved some fun games focusing on dribbling and keeping control of the ball. The day finished with a Q&A session where Paul talked about his roles in Avatar, Doctor Who & Fantastic Beasts (to name a few!)

He left SPJS having taught us all a very powerful message about how it's good to be different and how we are all born to stand out.



Y3 TRIP TO BUTSER FARM



On Thursday 21st September, Year 3 had the opportunity to visit Butser Ancient Farm - an open-air, archaelogy museum - where they learnt all about 'Stone Age to Iron Age'.

The children had a wonderful time discovering this period of time in a hands-on, practical way. They were able to sit inside a replica Iron Age house around an open fire, and had the opportunity to wattle fences, make pots from clay taken out of the ground, create their own copper jewellery and carve chalk to create their own pieces of Stone Age art.

The children strived to show their Sense of Pride by listening carefully, answering questions clearly, following the instructions given and trying out the new skills taught on the day.



By the end of the day they were both messy and exhausted - a clear sign that they had given 100% to all of the experiences on offer. We now look forward to building upon their knowledge and understanding throughout this exciting history topic.
