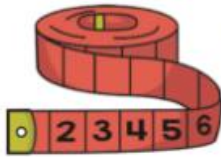

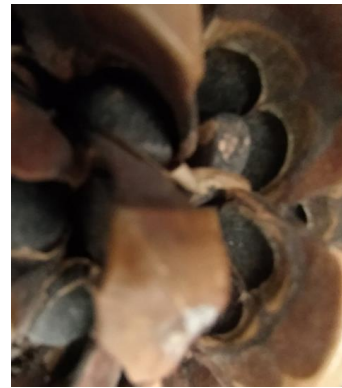
RIDDLE
