Sports Premium Funding Report Academic Year 2022-23

What is School Sport Funding?

The government is providing additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. It is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. As a school we were allocated £19,670 for the academic year 2022-23. Schools have flexibility on how they use the funding but it should be used to increase and improve physical education available to pupils. Development and training of staff to provide sustainable improvements is also a key focus.
