Sports Premium Funding Report 1st April 2020-31st March 2021

What is School Sport Funding?

The government is providing additional funding to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. It is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. From Sept 2019, funding is a £16000 lump sum with an additional £10.00 per child aged 5-11. As a school we were allocated £19,600 for the financial year April 2020-March 2021. (Last year we underspent our allocation by £3193) Schools have flexibility on how they use the funding but it should be used to increase and improve physical education available to pupils. Development and training of staff to provide sustainable improvements is also a key focus. This year, due to COVID restrictions schools sporting activities have been severely curtailed, therefore we have been granted permission to carry forward our allocation to spend up to March 22.

Here at Stanley Park Junior School we hope to see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

- 1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- 2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- 3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5. increased participation in competitive sport

We continue to develop our Sports Premium Plan to raise standards and participation levels in PE throughout the school.
