Sports Premium Funding Report 1st April 2016-31st March 17

What is School Sport Funding?

The government is providing additional funding of £150 million per annum to improve provision of physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding is provided jointly by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. It is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. Funding is an £8000 lump sum with an additional £5.00 per child aged 5-11. **As a school we were allocated £9795 for the financial year 2016-March 2017. We had a carry forward of £1567.86 last year so this year we had a total of £11,362.86** Schools have flexibility on how they use the funding but it should be used to increase and improve physical education available to pupils. Development and training of staff to provide sustainable improvements is also a key focus.

ALL pupils leaving primary school **physically literate** and with the **knowledge, skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy, active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport

Here at Stanley Park Junior School we hope to see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity - kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. increased participation in competitive sport

We continue to develop our Sports Premium Plan to raise standards and participation levels in PE throughout the school.
